



## SAT TEST PROTOCOL DURING COVID-19 STUDENTS

### 1. Prior to student entry

- a. Print, fill out and sign the affidavit - MINSA-approved symptomatology card
- b. Bring the following:
  - DNI or official identification with picture
  - Admission ticket issued by the College Board
  - Two (2) 2B pencils with eraser
  - College Board approved calculator ([models](#))
  - Water
  - Snack
  - Spray or gel alcohol
  - Recommended: lemon drops/candy

### 2. Before entering the Test Centre (Door check)

- a. Entry will be through the Santa Cruz Avenue gate.
- b. Doors will close at 8:00 am
- c. Only students will be allowed to enter, not accompanying persons.
- d. Two security guards will verify that the student's name is on the attendance list.
- e. In compliance with Peruvian regulations, we require that everyone uses a KN 95 mask or two masks (surgical and cloth) on a permanent basis.
- f. Sanitize hands with gel alcohol.
- g. Keep a minimum distance of two meters from person to person, at all times.

### 3. Student check-in and safety screening by Test Centre staff

- a. Students will go to an open area where they will sit keeping a minimum distance of two meters. Staff members will check their IDs and any other required items. They will clean their hands with 70% alcohol after finishing with each student.
- b. The staff will request the affidavit of symptoms provided by MINSA.
- c. Students will show their ID to staff who will check that information matches the admission ticket.
- d. If a member of staff requests the student to remove their mask, the student must stand two meters away and not speak.
- e. For students who wear a cloth or filter mask, the staff will provide a surgical mask. The student will change masks in an open space and wash or disinfect their hands afterwards.
- f. Once everyone has passed through Staff screening, they will go to the testing rooms in an orderly manner. This will be done minding the distance, respecting the biosafety protocols and following Staff directions.
- g. Before entering the test rooms, students will put their cell phones in their bags. If they do not have a bag, staff will label and keep them until the end of the test.

#### 4. During the test

- a. Students will be seated with a minimum separation of two meters.
- b. Staff will assign the students where to sit.
- c. Once everyone is seated, Staff will give out the test materials and read the instructions:
  - Students will remain in the classroom throughout the evaluation process.
  - Masks must be worn at all times.
  - Students may use the toilets as many times as needed, prior authorization from the staff.
  - During the breaks, students will be allowed to eat and stretch their muscles next to their seats.
  - Whilst eating, students must not talk to anyone since they will be without a mask.
- d. Students must keep a minimum distance of two meters from person to person at all times.
- e. A nurse will be available in a separate room on the third floor and will be ready to deal with any occurrence.

#### 5. Exiting the premises

- a. All students will leave the test rooms, collect their cell phones, and go down the stairs in an orderly manner respecting the safety protocols. They will wait in the synthetic field once again. Each one will sit in chairs three meters apart.
- b. Only students with their own transportation will be allowed to leave immediately. The rest of students will wait until the person collecting them is at the entrance gate and they are called by the designated Staff.
- c. Exit will be through the Av. Santa Cruz gate.

#### 6. Use of toilets

- a. There will be a toilet for women and men. These will be disinfected every two hours until the end of the test. Staff members will use a separate toilet.

**3** Frótese la palma de la mano derecha contra el dorso de la mano izquierda entrelazando los dedos y viceversa;



**4** Frótese las palmas de las manos entre sí, con los dedos entrelazados;



**5** Frótese el dorso de los dedos de una mano con la palma de la mano opuesta, agarrándose los dedos;



**6** Frótese con un movimiento de rotación el pulgar izquierdo, atrapándolo con la palma de la mano derecha y viceversa;



**7** Frótese la punta de los dedos de la mano derecha contra la palma de la mano izquierda, haciendo un movimiento de rotación y viceversa;



**8** Enjuáguese las manos con agua;



**9** Séquese con una toalla desechable;



**10** Sírvese de la toalla para cerrar el grifo;



**11** Sus manos son seguras.

**⌚ Duración de todo el procedimiento: 20-30 segundos**



Deposite en la palma de la mano una dosis de producto suficiente para cubrir todas las superficies;



Frótese las palmas de las manos entre sí;



Frótese la palma de la mano derecha contra el dorso de la mano izquierda entrelazando los dedos y viceversa;



Frótese las palmas de las manos entre sí, con los dedos entrelazados;



Frótese el dorso de los dedos de una mano con la palma de la mano opuesta, agarrándose los dedos;



Frótese con un movimiento de rotación el pulgar izquierdo, atrapándolo con la palma de la mano derecha y viceversa;



Frótese la punta de los dedos de la mano derecha contra la palma de la mano izquierda, haciendo un movimiento de rotación y viceversa;



Una vez secas, sus manos son seguras.
